校務報告 PRINCIPAL'S REPORT 2023-2024

1 THE INCORPORATED MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

- 1.1 Under the leadership of our Supervisor, Ms. Wong Lai Fun Paulina, the IMC, which is comprised of different school stakeholders, held three meetings in 2023-24, in which important school policies were formulated.
- 1.2 Besides attending IMC meetings, school managers participated in various school activities and provided their expertise in school planning, finance management, legal matters and tender selection.
- 1.3 The Lam family has provided continuous support for the school. To promote Chinese cultural development, the former supervisor Dr. Gennie Lee made a generous donation, enabling us to implement a school-based Chinese language curriculum, Chinese culture programs, and activities. In appreciation of her kindness and support, the School Hall was named 建華堂 in her honor.

2 STAFF

- 2.1 There were 93 staff members: The Principal, 55 full-time and 2 part-time teachers, 1 assistant teacher, 2 school social workers, 1 part-time educational psychologist, 1 part-time school chaplain, 3 laboratory technicians, 4 teaching assistants, 8 office staff members, 3 technical service support technicians and 9 full-time and 4 part-time janitors.

6 40th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

- (1) The 40th Anniversary Alumni Dinner, held on 25 November 2023, was a resounding success. Attendees, including IMC members, staff, PTA members, and alumni, shared heartfelt experiences and enjoyed reconnecting with old friends. The event highlighted the strong sense of community and lasting bonds within our school family. We thank everyone who participated and made the evening memorable.
- (2) The 40th Anniversary School Journal was finalized and published in January 2024. It showcases students' achievements through artwork, photography, articles, and creative writing, preserving many cherished memories. The journal fosters collaboration and concerted efforts among various parties. A big thank you to all the guests, alumni, and parents for their encouraging words and blessings.
- (3) The 40th Anniversary Concert—musical *Fame*, held on 9 and 10 September 2023 dazzled audiences with electrifying performances. The concerted efforts of dedicated teachers and talented students brought the beloved story to life. Their hard work and exceptional talent made the event a resounding success, celebrating the school's 40th anniversary spectacularly.

7 LEARNING AND TEACHING

Professional Development Activities in 2023-2024

- 7.1 In the 2023-2024 academic year, several professional development activities were organized to address the specific needs of our school community:
 - (1) The first staff development day, held on November 1, 2023, was a highly productive and enriching experience. The highlight of the day was an insightful talk titled "Effective Communication with Parents." This session provided educators with valuable strategies to enhance parent-teacher interactions, emphasizing the importance of clear, empathetic, and

- constructive communication. By fostering a supportive school environment, the talk aimed to strengthen the partnership between parents and teachers, ultimately benefiting student development and well-being.
- (2) The second staff development day occurred on April 30, 2024. The day featured an engaging session led by an Educational Psychologist, who shared expert insights on "Raising the Learning Motivation of Students." This session offered practical techniques and psychological principles to inspire and motivate students in their academic pursuits. Additionally, the day included team-building activities, such as board games and camp exercises, designed to strengthen camaraderie and teamwork among the teaching staff, fostering a more cohesive and collaborative working environment.
- (3) To further our commitment to student-centred pedagogies, teachers engaged in a peer lesson observation initiative. Working in pairs, educators observed each other's classes with a focus on implementing and refining student-centred teaching methods. This collaborative approach allowed teachers to share best practices, provide constructive feedback, and collectively enhance their instructional strategies, ultimately benefiting the students' learning experience.

7.2 Self-Directed Learning Initiatives

- (1) Self-directed learning was a key focus this year. Various class-time programmes were organized to help students take charge of their learning processes. These programmes guided students in setting short-term and long-term goals, planning their studies, evaluating their progress, and writing progress reports in their student handbooks.
- (2) A learning skills workshop was specifically organized for F.1 students, introducing them to different learning styles and effective note-taking techniques. In the second term, a revision skills workshop was held for lessable students, equipping them with valuable revision techniques, tools, and tips to enhance the effectiveness of their study practices.
- (3) Additionally, a talk on self-directed learning was held on May 14, 2024, highlighting the importance of students taking an active role in their education. To further emphasize this concept, a drama titled "風高浪急奇遇記" was performed on May 24, 2024, illustrating the significance of being proactive and engaged learners.

7.3 National Security Education and Value Education

National Security Education and Value Education were integrated into the formal curriculum this year. Each department conducted a comprehensive review and updated its plans to include these critical topics within the relevant subjects. This initiative ensured that students receive a well-rounded education that encompasses important national and ethical values.

7.4 Measures to Cater for Learners' Diversity

To address learners' diversity and enhance learning effectiveness, the Learning and Teaching Committee, along with subject coordinators, implemented various measures:

- (1) A whole-school approach to gifted education was adopted, encouraging teachers to take online courses on the subject. Teachers were reminded to recognize students' giftedness not only in specific areas but also to explore their thinking abilities, creativity, and social skills. Sixteen students were enrolled in gifted education programs provided by the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education. Additionally, subsidies were offered to students participating in courses on gifted education.
- (2) Utilizing the Diversity Learning Grant and resources from alumni, extra tutorial classes were arranged. These enrichment classes generally benefited participating students, leading to improvements in the related subjects. Afterschool revision classes were held for students who underperformed in the first-term examination. Alumni were invited to tutor these students, providing them with additional support to enhance their academic performance.
- 7.5 The school has implemented various initiatives and activities to strengthen STEAM education.
 - (1) Cross-curricular collaboration: The STEAM education committee collaborated with various subjects to carry out cross-curricular activities. These activities aimed to help students develop relevant knowledge and skills, nurturing their innovative thinking and problem solving. Activities included projects on coffin design, physical fitness assessment, personalized bookmarks, urban planning, spaghetti bridge building, and designing water filters.

- (2) Diverse learning experiences: The STEAM education committee also provides students with diverse learning experiences to broaden their horizons, enhance social awareness and problem solving, and nurture entrepreneurial and innovative mindsets. Activities spanned media communication, community service, industrial exposure, intellectual property, and brand design. Notable examples include a "Young Politician Training Class," an interschool community service project, and a brand design workshop for a local brand.
- (3) Other Learning Experiences: Students participated in a variety of learning opportunities beyond the classroom, such as radio interviews, community service, industrial visits, brand design workshops, and patent applications. These experiences broadened students' horizons and nurtured their entrepreneurial and innovative mindsets.
- (4) Students excelled in STEAM and innovation competitions, winning top prizes in robotics, science, and engineering events. They were honored with youth progress and extracurricular awards. The school provided *Unity* development courses to enhance students' practical skills. These achievements showcase the students' strategic thinking, leadership, and environmental awareness, as well as the school's commitment to fostering innovation and excellence.
- (5) The IT Innovation Lab Fund Project immersed students in cutting-edge technologies through the "Designing Robotic Arm Application" activity. By integrating AI into robotic arm design and programming, students explored the transformative power of emerging technology and gained exposure to IT-related careers. The project cultivated creativity, problem solving, collaboration, and computational thinking skills, empowering students to navigate the digital landscape and contribute to technological innovation.
- 7.6 The new English Language Curriculum aims to equip students with the skills, experiences, and competencies essential for effective communication and collaboration in English within an increasingly interconnected and technology-driven world. At its core, the curriculum focuses on cultivating critical thinking, problem-solving abilities, creativity, and innovation cognitive capabilities that are crucial for students to thrive as adaptable, empathetic, and lifelong learners with strong values. To enhance students' English proficiency and provide authentic contexts for language use, the curriculum incorporates a diverse range of learning tasks and activities both within and beyond the classroom setting.

These engaging initiatives or activities include events such as Battles of the Books, Reading Bonanza, Debates, Fashion Shows, and Drama Competitions, which not only foster language development but also encourage students to explore their interests, express themselves creatively, and collaborate with their peers in meaningful ways.

- 7.7 The Chinese Department successfully secured school support services from the EDB once again, allowing them to continue optimizing their curriculum and improving teaching strategies and lesson designs.
- 7.8 The library aims to foster cross-disciplinary collaboration, enhance inter-school relationships, and promote independent learning. By offering diverse activities, workshops, and book exchanges, it seeks to cultivate a love for reading, support academic growth, and build a community of engaged, lifelong learners. Additionally, it encourages cultural appreciation and provides resources to aid in the holistic development of students, preparing them for future academic and personal success.
- 7.9 The art activities for 2023-24 included a lift lobby art installation project, an upcycling furniture project, an animation AR project, and a Guangcai Making Workshop. The lift lobby project aims to raise awareness about upcycled plastic, reduce waste, and promote sustainability. The up-cycling furniture project encourages students to be self-directed learners and problem solvers by reusing abandoned school furniture. The animation AR project enhances students' understanding and appreciation of animation art while fostering creativity and imagination. The Guangcai Making Workshop is part of the Jockey Club ICH+ Innovative Heritage Education Programme. These activities provide hands-on learning experiences and promote environmental responsibility.

8 STUDENT SUPPORT AND SCHOOL ETHOS

8.1 Whole-School Approach to Student Development
The school adopted a whole-school approach to supporting student
development. Various support programs were co-planned by different functional
groups, focusing on promoting students' social-emotional development.

8.2 Religious Activities and Christian Values

Day 7 assemblies, the annual Christmas service, and the Easter service were organized to enrich religious vibes and promote Christian values at school. Teachers, pastors, guest speakers, and alumni were invited to deliver messages during the Day 7 assemblies, while the student worship team led hymns. One Circle, a popular local worship organization, was invited to share the Gospel in a style relevant to teenagers during the Christmas Service, generating significant interest among students in Christian beliefs.

8.3 Year-Round Religious Activities

Religious activities were organized throughout the year to educate students about Christian beliefs and foster a caring environment at school and in the community. Gospel Week in March 2024 included creative activities like "Free Hug" and "Immersive Experience – A Trip of Jesus," which helped students learn about Christian beliefs and provided genuine support to those in need. Members from Shatin Church also participated in lunchtime worship. Additionally, F.3 and F.6 Caring Action initiatives promoted compassion and caring culture, while volunteer work in May 2024 for the elderly spread God's love in the community.

8.4 Spiritual Growth and Fellowship Activities

Regular Bible Study groups were held to nurture students' spiritual growth. A day camp for retreats was organized at The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups-Jockey Club Sai Kung Outdoor Training Camp in April 2024 for the Christian fellowship committee members, where students were restored, refreshed, and revived. A joint-school fellowship activity with SKH Tsang Shiu Tim Secondary School increased students' exposure and allowed them to exchange testimonies about their Christian life.

8.5 Church-School Cooperation

Cooperation between the church and school deepened this year. An assistant pastor from HKSKH Holy Spirit Church provided pastoral care, and church volunteers participated in regular Bible Study groups and followed up with students interested in Christian beliefs from the Christmas service. The school worship team participated in the church's Christmas carol event and a fundraising carnival celebrating the church's 45th anniversary in April 2024.

8.6 Discipline and Guidance

The Discipline and Guidance Committee held regular meetings to discuss cases and took immediate action when appropriate. Guidance teachers, the SENCO, school social workers, the school-based educational psychologist, and the speech therapist communicated, cooperated, and coordinated effectively.

8.7 Teacher Training

Guidance teachers were encouraged to join an online mediation course conducted by the Hong Kong Family Welfare Society in June 2024 for effective counseling work.

8.8 Post-Pandemic Emotional Support

Despite society returning to normalcy, many students continued to struggle with emotional and interpersonal issues post-pandemic. Guidance and discipline teachers, along with school social workers, maintained close communication with parents to handle such cases effectively.

8.9 Mental Health Days

To address students' emotional needs and promote positive thinking, four mental health days were organized. Activities included a photo exhibition titled "Life: Power and Hope," an exhibition called "Failuregram," and relaxing activities such as Aroma Stone Making, Alcohol Ink Art, Air Plant Terrarium Making, and Acrylic Pouring Painting. Game booths provided students with a break and an opportunity to reflect on their academic lives.

8.10 Emotional and Stress Management

Form periods focused on understanding, accepting, and dealing with different types of emotions for F.1 to F.5 students. F.6 students received form periods on handling stress. Various training groups with themes such as fitness and art were arranged for students in need.

8.11 Pupil Ambassador Scheme

Twelve students joined the Pupil Ambassador Scheme 2023-24, organized by the Education Bureau. This scheme aims to cultivate and promote positive life attitudes within the school community. The selected students underwent training and participated in various activities designed to enhance their leadership skills, emotional intelligence, and ability to inspire their peers.

8.12 Recognition Scheme

Teachers praised students' positive attitudes and good behavior through the Recognition Scheme. This year, 175 students received merits, while 264 students received praise, boosting their confidence and self-esteem.

8.13 Peer Counselling Scheme

The "Hand-in-hand" Peer Counselling Scheme continued this year, helping F.1 students adapt to their new school life. Trained peer counselors from F.4 and F.5 conducted activities for F.1 students and met them regularly to provide support.

8.14 "Iron Man" Program

All F.2 students participated in the "Iron Man" program at the beginning of the academic year. The program improved students' resilience and self-discipline through teamwork and challenging tasks, receiving positive feedback from both students and teachers.

8.15 The "All-Round Development Scheme" recognized students' achievements in conduct, academic work, co-curricular activities, and religious/community service. This scheme encouraged students to strive for betterment in all aspects of their school life.

8.16 LKM Scholars Scheme

The LKM Scholars Scheme was introduced in F.1 this year to promote self-directed learning. Students were required to learn something new during the Lunar New Year holiday. Those who demonstrated outstanding performance were invited to share their experiences in a Day-2 assembly, serving as role models for their peers.

8.17 Class Spirit Cultivation Scheme

The Class Spirit Cultivation Scheme was adopted at different levels to strengthen the bonds between students and enhance their sense of belonging to the class. Inter-class competitions, initiated and organized by class committees, were held from F.1 to F.4 to foster class spirit and unity.

8.18 Child Development Fund Project

Fourteen students participated in the 9th batch of the Child Development Fund Project. This initiative aimed to encourage students to plan for their future, develop saving habits, and accumulate intangible assets such as positive attitudes, personal resilience, and social networks.

8.19 Integration Education

To promote inclusive education, form period materials were prepared to encourage acceptance and appreciation of individual differences. Various activities and training groups were provided for students with special educational needs to help them adapt to the social and learning environment, enabling them to fully participate in and enjoy school life.

8.20 Prefects Training Camps

The Prefects Training Day Camp was held in December 2023 at school, and the Prefect overnight training camp took place in July 2024 at The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups-Jockey Club Sai Kung Outdoor Training Camp. These camps aimed to equip prefects with the necessary knowledge and skills to effectively handle problems while developing their leadership and fostering a strong team spirit.

8.21 Cybercrime Awareness Talk

To raise students' legal awareness and promote appropriate online behavior, the school invited School Liaison Officer Sergeant Chan Man-keung from the Police Community Relations Office to give a talk on cybercrime in December 2023.

8.22 Service Learning

The school continued to emphasize the importance of service learning, which enhances students' empathy and connection with the community. Various types of voluntary service activities were arranged across different forms providing students with diverse opportunities to engage with and contribute to their community meaningfully.

8.23 Exchange Tour

An exchange tour was arranged during the Easter Holiday to Chongqing Bashu High School (重慶市巴蜀中學校), one of our sister schools in Mainland China, to celebrate their 90th School Anniversary. Our School Choir was invited to participate in cultural and aesthetic exchanges with the choir of the sister school. The trip broadened students' horizons and paved the way for more exchange activities in the future, benefiting students from both schools.

9 STUDENTS' PERFORMANCE

9.1 HKDSE 2023

109 students took the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education in 2023. In all subjects on average, the percentage of students attaining level 5 or above is 22.6%, that of level 4 or above is 59.6%, and that of level 2 or above is 97.5%. 86.2% of our students met the general entrance requirements of UGC-funded institutions. A total of 94 students received JUPAS offers.

- 10.1 The 18th Parent Teacher Association Committee was established in November 2023. I am thankful for the experienced and honorable members who continue to volunteer their time and effort, attending our meetings and offering assistance whenever needed. This year, we organized numerous well-received activities for parents, including a day camp, a local cultural tour to Tai O, an everlasting flowers workshop, a film appreciation event, and a Form 6 cheering activity.
- 10.2 The Alumni Association actively participated in numerous school activities and major events. They continued to offer career guidance to our senior-form students. The Beyond Limits Award Scheme, aimed at recognizing students' achievements in various aspects, was held for the eleventh consecutive year, thanks to the Alumni Association's sponsorship. Alumni from multiple generations returned to school on Alumni Day to enjoy friendly sports competitions, making it a joyful occasion for both teachers and alumni. The highlight of their contributions was the Alumni Dinner, which showcased the strong sense of community and enduring bonds not only between the school and alumni but also among different stakeholders within our school family.
